Daily Tidings of Zion

Conference of Restoration Elders

Wednesday, April 6, 2005

The conference opened with the singing of hymn no. 307 and a prayer by Gary Moreland. Richard Neill read the scripture from the 17th Section of the D. and C.

The minutes of the Daily Tidings were reviewed. Corrections to the minutes are:

Corrections

Robert Whenham was not to be on the list of credentialed elders as reported on Monday's minutes.

The names of Lee and Crystal Hillard as nominees for the Youth Council had been omitted from the ballot.

Rudy Leutzinger noted that the resolution brought by Quorum No. 4 regarding "national ministers" had been omitted from the minutes.

Vim Horn noted that the item, T7 Melchisedec Priesthood Guidelines, which had been lain on the table be brought back for consideration should have been added to the minutes.

The minutes as amended passed unanimously.

Dan Brotherton reported that there were 233 elders credentialed thus far.

George Mefford read five additional names from the Credentials Committee.

Bob Ruch
Bob Schrunk

Richard Neill noted that there were 3 elders whose credentials had been challenged. Two have worked through the appeals process. He needed 2 additional elders to act in the final appeals process.

He then asked for a list of legislation to come forth in this morning's business session.

Resolution presented by Quorum No. 4,

T9 Working Relationship with Pastors of Zion, the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs, and Spiritual Preparation Fellowship.

Whereas, “the Lord called his people Zion because they were of one heart and one mind, and dwelt in righteousness . . . “ (Doc. & Cov. 36:3h); and

Whereas, latter day revelation commands, “Be one; and if ye are not one, ye are not mine.” (Doc. & Cov. 38:6a); and

Whereas, the purpose of the Conference of Restoration Elders is “to bring solidarity to a growing number of Restoration branches and Latter Day Saints in general during this period of disruption and fragmentation (Conference “Operating Guidelines” accepted 1996)”; and

Whereas, the Lord is moving with boldness to establish His Zion in these latter days; therefore

Be It Resolved that the Conference of Restoration Elders encourage and direct the various councils and committees to be in the forefront of those movements which seek to spiritually and temporally unite the saints and branches under the testimony of Jesus and the law of God; and be it further

Resolved that the Conference Chair and Coordinating Council shall direct in all of these activities and provide logistical support as inspiration and wisdom may dictate; and be it further

Resolved that the Conference of Restoration Elders shall especially support and assist the Area Pastors of Zion, the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs, and Spiritual Preparation Fellowship (a committee organized through the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs to assist in this very work) in their activities to unite the saints and branches.

The Melchisedec Guidelines need to be discussed.

It was noted that the Melchisedec Credentials Committee meets for 1 week only during conference.

He again reviewed the need for 2 elders from each quorum today to act on the Elders Council (10 elders in total) for this conference to consider appeals. Also a member of the Coordinating Council and the Credentials Committee were needed to present their decisions to the Elders Council regarding credential status.

He noted the difference between the Elders Council elected by the quorums to consider whether individuals referred by the credential committee were to be seated or not and the Elders Council that are on the ballot that serves for the calendar year.

This needs to be done so that the Elders Council, a representative from the Coordinating Council and the Credentials Committee along with those individuals concerned whose credentials are being questioned may meet today and have that resolved. Two of these individuals have worked through this process and the third has yet to complete the process.

It was noted that Quorums No. 1, 2, 4 and 5 had submitted the names of two elders for the Elders Council.

Some of them were for the annual council.

Vim Horn inquired that when the Quorum leaders make their reports if they had not elected elders from their quorums, that when they do, they could ask them if they could serve on this week’s Elders Council and that this would facilitate that process. Also if the Quorum leaders could ask the ones they have already nominated if they could serve as well.

Richard Neill said that would certainly be possible.

Richard Neill asked if Mel Doubledee and Russ Reid whose names were given yesterday would serve on the Elder's Council for this week. They responded that they would.

QUORUM REPORTS

Quorum No. 1 (Russell Reid) requested that the following motion that had passed unanimously in their quorum be presented to the floor:

T10 Increasing Members on Councils

“Whereas the Lord's work is growing rapidly in many areas in the Restoration causing a heavy burden on so few therefore:

Be it resolved that the following Councils be increased in number from seven members to nine: Coordinating, Evangelism, Publications, Stewardship, Women's, Youth and Aaronic. This to be effective next year (2006-2007) if approved.

Richard Neill asked if the two names given him yesterday of Jack Evans and Bill Fehmer would be able to serve. Jack Hagensen said that they would.

Quorum No. 2 (Jack Hagensen) reported that Rudy Leutzinger's resolution passed unanimously. Howard Parker reported that T7 and had some changes with paragraph 6a and some other information that was brought in by one of the brethren. We voted on some alternatives. We made some alternates and passed it. We made some changes on paragraph 6a and 8 and that eventually passed. Then we also had nominations for the year long Elders Council and the same names were given for that (Jack Evans and Bill Fehmer).

We considered the resolution from Quorum No. 4: T9 Working Relationship with Pastors of Zion, the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs, and Spiritual Preparation Fellowship

Quorum No. 2 created the following amendments to T9 as listed below:

Strike “especially support” and add the word “encourage”.

Added “inasmuch as these activities are in harmony with the policies of the CRE.”

Richard Neill said that Quorum No. 3 had not submitted the names necessary and asked if they had them ready. Gary Metzger said the names were Jim Crane and Dale Carrick.

Quorum No. 3 (Gary Metzger) reported that T7, Credentials Guidelines, was passed. We also used the words from Quorum 4 regarding the national minister. We also concurred and passed the following resolution:

T11 Definition of National Ministers

Resolved: That the Evangelism Council and the Coordinating Council be assigned to investigate the function and application of the National Minister and report back to the 2006 Conference.

That was passed unanimously. We sustained Andy O'Neill as our Chairman.

Quorum No. 4 (Rudy Leutzinger) The resolution T7 extends the Melchisedec Guidelines to cover all officers and councils of the conference. Anyone who fails to maintain those standards should be disqualified to serve on the councils or as an officer.

A resolution to endorse the Society of Professional Organizations was brought to the conference.

Quorum No. 5 (Steve Ferdig) had no report.

Patriarchs, Seventies, Aaronic, Members, Women's and Youth Councils were asked for reports and there were none.

Quorum No. 4 needs to select 1 additional member as Kreg Levengood could not let his name stand for the Elders Council.

It was noted that the beginning section of T7 was inserted for informational background only and was not an actual part of the resolution. (Line 11 on page 6-1 to Line 7 on page 6-2)

Additional corrections were made on the Election of Officers ballot.

Nathan Sherer reported that Rachel Bailey would like to have her name removed from the Youth Council and that his name, Nathan Sherer, be removed as well. His wife Michelle White's name be changed to Michelle Sherer and her name is to remain.

To clarify those standing for the Chairman of the Conference, Richard Neill had the following nominees stand:

1. Rudy Leutzinger
2. Paul Gage
3. Dan Brotherton
4. Robert Rolfe

It was noted that the Historian's name had been left off the ballot, Jim Daughtery.

After the vote the ballots were collected.

The resolution on Melchisedec Guidelines on pages 6-1, 2, 3 and 4 was brought up for discussion.

Bob Giertz moved the motion on page 6-2, lines 11-32. Skip Robison seconded. He noted that on page 6-1 from line 9 to line 46 and on page 6-2 from line 1 to 7 was for informational purposes only and not part of the resolution.

Vim Horn moved to amend the document. On page 6-2 of T7, on line 38, vote to strike the word "participating" after the word "elder" and on line 40, remove the words "by the body" and insert the words "by a future conference."

He moved that paragraph 6a on page Section 9-6 and 9-7 on the minutes from April 5 (pink minutes) be substituted for paragraph 6a, line 31 on Section 6-3 to line 6 on Section 6-4 (original proposal on white pages). We also have a substitute for paragraph 8 which begins on page 6-4, line 12.

Vim Horn then read the Possible Alternative to Proposed Changes in the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines printed on pages Section 9-6 and 9-7 of yesterday's minutes. He said that the reference for the standards they included in the resolution were included the Church Members Manual. He noted the word "verified" had been inserted in the first paragraph of 6a. He also noted the words "may" had been inserted in paragraph 6a.

He explained paragraph 8 as it was written was meant to preserve the rights of the body to do business and not have to be consumed with business of the credentials committee.

Brian Mundy moved to make an amendment to the amendment to strike the entirety of section 6a from the proposal. John Mundy seconded the motion. Brian spoke to the motion. After some discussion, a vote was called and the amendment to the amendment failed.

Discussion resumed on the amendment.

Paul Ludy moved that at the end of second paragraph of 6a that everything after the words to minister effectively be stricken from the amendment.

6a. As ministers representing the Church of Jesus Christ are charged with the personal responsibility of maintaining the highest standards of Christian conduct, verified failure to maintain such standards may constitute grounds for denying or revoking one's right to voice, vote, and participation in CRE activities. Unchristian conduct includes but is not limited to any of the following:

"Lying, backbiting, adultery, and kindred sins, as well as contracting bad debts, drunkenness, other substance abuse, giving occasion for harmful gossip, willful failure to preserve or maintain a shared confidence, misuse or abuse of priesthood privileges, and such other disregard for the standards of Christian conduct as may result in loss of power to minister effectively ~~and may lead to not being credentialized for participation in the CRE.~~

The amendment to the amendment passed but not unanimously.

Discussion resumed on the amendment.

Bob Immer moved that in paragraph 8, "Appeals of the decision of the Credentials Committee for seating shall be made in writing and submitted to CRE Coordinating Council for review, consideration and action. This I believe is an appeal and gives the individual rights to an appeal and I move that everything after consideration and action be stricken and add "the decision of the CRE Coordinating Council shall be final." Rudy Leutzinger seconded.

8. Appeals of the decision of the Credentials Committee for seating shall be made in writing and submitted to CRE Coordinating Council for review, consideration and action. ~~If the appeal is denied, and one of the parties involved desires to appeal the decision of the Coordinating Council, a committee of elders, 2 from each of the quorums meeting in conference, will be selected to review and consider the appeal. The selected representatives will consider the appeal during the convening conference, and render a decision that shall be final. In this way the rights of the individual, and the rights of the body to consider matters pertaining to the conference, will be preserved and protected.~~

Discussion ensued on the amendment to the amendment.

Jerry Rowlett raised the previous question on all previous amendments. Richard Neill clarified that this meant the vote would include voting on the amendments to the amendments including the original resolution, T7.

The previous question carried by the necessary 2/3 majority.

Richard Neill clarified that the first amendment to be voted was the one presented by Bob Immer regarding paragraph 8 on Section 9-7 of yesterday's minutes which reads as follows

8. Appeals of the decision of the Credentials Committee for seating shall be made in writing and submitted to CRE Coordinating Council for review, consideration and action which action will be final.

The amendment to the amendment failed.

Richard Neill then clarified that the next amendment to be voted on is in three parts which are:

1. On Section 6-2, line 38 on the white sheets, strike the word "participating" and on line 40 strike the words "by the body" and insert "by a future conference."
2. On Section 9-6 of the pink minutes from yesterday, concerning paragraph 6a. specifically, the second paragraph which starts "Lying, backbiting, etc." the words "and may lead to not being credentialized for participation in the CRE." shall be stricken and the sentence end after the words "to minister effectively."
3. That paragraph 8 on Section 9-7, from yesterday's minutes (pink sheets), shall be substituted for paragraph 8 Section 6-4 (white pages)."

The amendment to the motion was voted upon. It was carried, but not unanimously.

The main motion, T7, as amended came to a vote. It carried, but not unanimously.

T7 MELCHISEDEC CREDENTIALS GUIDELINES

Amended April 6, 2005

The following guidelines will serve as a basis for seating all elders in the current assembly and in other CRE activities, and continue in effect unless, or until altered by a future conference.

1. For purposes of these guidelines, the words "Restoration Branch" are defined as any organized body which holds as its tenets the original doctrines of the restored Church of Jesus Christ as founded by Joseph Smith, Jr., through prophetic leadership.

2. For the purposes of these guidelines, the word "faction" is defined as any organized body not adhering to the original doctrines of the Restored Church of Jesus Christ as founded by Joseph Smith, Jr., or which practice doctrine not in compliance with the Statement of Faith and Doctrine adopted by the 1993 Conference of Restoration elders – i.e., the ordination of women to the priesthood offices, the practice of open communion, the practice of washing of feet and the ordaining of men to offices where a proper calling cannot be initiated without authorized apostolic or presidential action.

3. Participation shall be extended to all Melchisedec priesthood accepted by Restoration branches whose office and ordination have been recognized by the same.

4. Participation shall be extended to all Melchisedec priesthood who, while not joined with a branch, have been authoritatively ordained and who have continued faithful to their calling by supporting the "Restoration Position" and have been approved by the Credentials Committee of said conference or the Coordinating Council between conferences.

5. Participation shall be extended to all Melchisedec priesthood who were authoritatively ordained and who, for reasons of conscience or physical location, have continued to minister within the framework of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, but who have not subscribed to nor participated in divergent practices or doctrine.

6. Participation shall be extended to all Melchisedec priesthood who were authoritatively ordained in the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints or a restoration branch-but who may have since affiliated with one or more of the factional movements-who are willing to renounce said affiliation and repent of any participation in divergent practices or doctrines; including, but not limited to the rejection of any subsequent ordinations.

6a. As ministers representing the Church of Jesus Christ are charged with the personal responsibility of maintaining the highest standards of Christian conduct, verified failure to maintain such standards may constitute grounds for denying or revoking one's right to voice, vote, and participation in CRE activities. Unchristian conduct includes but is not limited to any of the following:

"Lying, backbiting, adultery, and kindred sins, as well as contracting bad debts, drunkenness, other substance abuse, giving occasion for harmful gossip, willful failure to preserve or maintain a shared confidence, misuse or abuse of priesthood privileges, and such other disregard for the standards of Christian conduct as may result in loss of power to minister effectively.

Briefly stated, the facts are that the membership should at all times and in all places remember that the standards of the church are the standards of Jesus Christ. Should doubt arise in the mind as to the legitimacy of certain acts or procedures, reference to the life and pattern of the

Master will give all the necessary answers that may be required. This is the supreme test of discipleship.”

“It cannot be over-emphasized that any such disciplinary action which may be taken by the CRE is in no way punitive, but in all cases it is to reclaim the fallen, but where willfulness is evidenced in continuing in wrongdoing, the CRE has no option but to act to preserve its good influence in the community.”

“The church is jealous of its name as the Church of Jesus Christ and is bound morally and spiritually to ensure that it is held high by all who enter into its privileges. At no time should a member of the church give way to temptation that will place in jeopardy the high and holy privileges of sainthood or priesthood.” (Sources: Church Member’s Manual, Chapter Four, *The Standards of Sainthood*, Herald Publishing House, 1947 and GCR 1158, 1980)

Upon the written statements of two or more credible witnesses to conduct on the part of any Melchisedec priesthood member that is unbecoming to that priesthood member or conduct that is detrimental to his ministry or the ministry of others, the Credentials Committee—or Coordinating Council between Conferences—may review that person’s participation in the Conference of Restoration Elders and may, if necessary, refuse or remove the person’s authority to participate.

7. Circumstances not covered in the above may be reviewed and acted upon by the credentials Committee on an individual basis. Effective application of the above is contingent upon a close, cooperative working relationship between branches in sharing of information, records, and decisions.

8. Appeals of the decision of the Credentials Committee for seating shall be made in writing and submitted to CRE Coordinating Council for review, consideration and action. If the appeal is denied, and one of the parties involved desires to appeal the decision of the Coordinating Council, a committee of elders, 2 from each of the quorums meeting in conference, will be selected to review and consider the appeal. The selected representatives will consider the appeal during the convening conference, and render a decision that shall be final. In this way the rights of the individual, and the rights of the body to consider matters pertaining to the conference, will be preserved and protected.

The conference adjourned the morning session with prayer by Steve Ferdig.

The meeting began with the singing of Hymn no. 336. A prayer was also offered.

Gordon Burns and Mark Burnard were approved by the credentials committee.

The following resolution was introduced by Quorum No. 1.

T10 Increasing Members on Councils

“Whereas the Lord’s work is growing rapidly in many areas in the Restoration causing a heavy burden on so few therefore:

Be it resolved that the following Councils be increased in number from seven members to nine: Coordinating, Evangelism, Publications, Stewardship, Women’s, Youth and Aaronic. This to be effective next year (2006-2007) if approved.

The motion was moved by George Mefford and seconded by Lyle Smith.

Discussion ensued. A vote was called and it was determined that an actual count needed to be taken. The motion failed.

Resolution **T12 Restructuring of the LAMB Board**, from Quorum no. 2 was introduced. The Chairman ruled this motion out of order.

Resolution **T11 Definition of National Ministers** from Quorum No. 3 was moved by Gary Piatt and seconded by George Gross.

Discussion ensued. The motion carried but not unanimously.

Resolution **T9 Working Relationship with Pastors of Zion, the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs, and Spiritual Preparation Fellowship** was read into the record. This was submitted by Quorum No. 4.

Rudy Leutzinger moved that resolution T9 be adopted. Bob White seconded.

Discussion ensued on the motion. Bob Immer made a motion to amend the resolution as shown below:

Be It Resolved that the Conference of Restoration Elders encourage and direct the various councils and committees to be in the forefront of those movements which seek to spiritually and temporally unite the saints and branches under the testimony of Jesus and the law of God; ~~and be it further~~ including but not limited to

~~**Resolved** that the Conference Chair and Coordinating Council shall direct in all of these activities and provide logistical support as inspiration and wisdom may dictate;~~

~~**Resolved** that the Conference of Restoration Elders shall especially support and assist the Area Pastors of Zion, the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs, and Spiritual Preparation~~

A vote was called and the amendment to the amendment failed.

Be It Resolved that the Conference of Restoration Elders **once again** encourage and direct the various councils and committees to be in the forefront of those movements which seek to spiritually and temporally unite the saints and branches under the testimony of Jesus and the law of God; ~~and be it further~~

~~**Resolved** that the Conference Chair and Coordinating Council shall direct in all of these activities and provide logistical support as inspiration and wisdom may dictate; and be it further~~

~~**Resolved** that the Conference of Restoration Elders shall especially support and assist the Area Pastors of Zion, the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs, and Spiritual Preparation Fellowship (a committee organized through the Fellowship of Restoration Patriarchs to assist in this very work) in their activities to unite the saints and branches.~~

Jerry Rowlett moved the previous question on the amendment to the amendment to the amendment to the motion. The motion carried.

A vote was called for on the amendment to the amendment to the amendment by Vim Horn. The motion carried. This supersedes the next two amendments.

A vote was called for the resolution as amended. It was passed by 2/3 majority.

Quorum No. 4 offered **T13 Setting Standards to Serve on Councils**

Whereas the Conference of Restoration Elders has adopted the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines to serve as the basis for seating all elders to participate in all CRE activities

Whereas the work of several councils are authorized under the authority of the Conference of Restoration Elders such as the Youth Council, Women's Council, Aaronic Council, etc.,

Whereas there has been no specific guidelines or criteria established for members nominated or appointed for members to serve on these councils,

Whereas the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines specifically forbid seating elders who are not in compliance with the statement of faith and doctrine adopted by the 1993 Conference of Restoration Elders i.e., the ordination of women to the priesthood offices, the practice of open communion, the practice of washing of feet and ordaining of men to offices where proper calling cannot be initiated without authorized apostolic or presidential action and

Whereas the adopted guidelines require elders desiring to be seated in the conference be above reproach and charges them with a personal responsibility of maintaining the highest standards of Christian conduct and furthermore declares the failure to maintain

such standards constitutes grounds for denying or revoking one's right, voice, vote and participation in CRE activities

Whereas one such grounds for disfellowship is unchristian conduct which includes but not limited to any of the following: conviction of a felony or other serious crimes, conduct constituting moral turpitude, willful disregard of church law, administration of the properly exercised authority of a supervising administrative church officer, etc.,

Therefore be it resolved that all officers appointed to various councils under the umbrella of the Conference of Restoration Elders authority be required to maintain said standards as enumerated in the Melchisedec Credentials Guidelines and that any priesthood or member nominated to serve on any of the various councils who fail to meet the Credentials Guidelines would be disqualified from being eligible to serve on any council associated with the Conference of Restoration Elders and

Be it further resolved that this be implemented with all future assignments and

Be it further resolved that the Coordinating Council shall review member status and fill open positions.

Jack Delany moved the resolution for consideration. George Gross seconded. Some discussion ensued. Lyle Smith moved to lay on the table. It was seconded. The motion to lay on the table carried.

Resolution T14 The Organization of Professional Societies

Whereas The Church of Jesus Christ has been called to seek the cause of Zion and

Whereas many members have pursued education and careers in the hope of using those talents and abilities to be used for the redemption of Zion these professions include but are not limited to architects, engineers, agriculture, chiropractic, nursing and health care, physicians, lawyers, teachers, computer technology

Be it resolved that the CRE endorse (sanction) the Organization of Professional Societies for the due purpose of meeting for fellowship of their profession and its role in the redemption of Zion

And be it further resolved that these societies be organized to meet on the Saturday before the conference.

Dayn Cederstrom moved that this resolution be adopted.

Some discussion ensued. The resolution carried.

Vim Horn called for a point of privilege and thanked Richard Neill for his work as Chairman and he was given a round of applause. Dan Brotherton called for a point of privilege and presented Richard with a plaque of appreciation and the thanks of the conference for his work over the past three years.

Results of the voting were announced. They are attached.

Brother Dan Schwartz has the one year term and Nathan Sherer has the two year term on the Evangelism Council.

Ron Lidberg announced that currently we have received \$12,012.54 for the conference expenses, which is over the \$11,000 needed. He stated that he had been happy to serve for the past 5 years as the treasurer. He received a round of applause for his work.

The conference recognized Jim Vun Cannon with a round of applause also.

Richard Neill thanked all the volunteers who helped make the conference run so smoothly for all their hard work.

Gary Metzger moved that a date be given for the January 2006 edition of the Tidings of Zion for our next conference and any meetings by the Patriarchs. Rudy Leutzinger seconded.

The motion carried.

Bud Solomon made a motion to adjourn. It was seconded and it carried.

The conference ended with Hymn No. 247 and Frances Harper offered the prayer.
