CRE Historian and CRE Historical Records

Since the CRE was formed, a historian was a part of the officers of the CRE. The functions of a historian for any group is to keep careful and up-to-date records of the group, its meetings and events. These records would be kept at a place where they would be available for research if needed. Since the CRE was formed, there are no records, conference books, etc. that have been kept.

Be it resolved, that the historian be not in name only but to act upon keeping the records of the conference, conference proceedings and events.

Be it resolved, that the historian of the CRE keep a conference book with complete minutes of the meetings, Daily Tidings, and other classes and events held during conference week, and sermons.

Be it further resolved, that the conference book and records be kept at the CRE office in a place where they could be available for future research and as a source of history of the CRE conferences for the CRE.

Be it further resolved, that this resolution will be acted upon for the purpose of keeping a good record an accurate of the CRE, and that the history of this body will not repeat itself in actions, for when history repeats itself, it means that a body has not learned to study history so that an event of action taken will not repeat itself. History has recorded many of these recorded events or actions with the result being the downfall of a country or a failure of a society, church or group of people.

Be it further resolved that the position of Historian be not limited to Elders. Any member can fill this office.

Be it further resolved that the historian is to present to the Coordinating Council the records for review once prior to conference and once in the mid-term between conference for their review and approval.
