How to Remain Free from Offense:

- Guard your thoughts – Psalm 19:14
- Keep your mind on God – Philippians 4:8-9
- Pray for help
- Think the best of people
- Learn from the trees: Psalm 1:1-2 > Psalm 119:165 > Psalm 1:3 Two

Major Categories of Offense:

1. Those treated unjustly
2. Those who believe they were treated unjustly

Beware of Pride: Revelation 3:17

Learning from Gold: Revelations 3:18

Sow Love > Reap Love: Galatians 6:8-9, Matthew 5:45-46, 48

Examples from the Scriptures: The Ungrateful Servant (Matthew 18:23-34)

Forgiveness:

- Isaiah 58:6
- 2 Corinthians 10:5
- Psalm 35:11-14
- 1 Nephi 1:65 Reconciliation:
- Matthew 5:25 – 26
- D & C 42:23a-d

Reconciliation If YOU Have Offended Others:

- Go in peace (Romans 14:19)
- LISTEN in humility
- Be willing to yield (James 3:17)
- If you don't agree, calmly discuss reasoning

Examples from the Scriptures: Moroni & Pahoran (Alma 27 & 28) Reconciliation if You Have Been Offended by OTHERS:

- Before you go to them: o Pray o Forgive FIRST
 - o Go in a spirit of reconciliation, not condemnation (James 1:20)
- During the Reconciliation:
 - 1) Assume the positive & listen for INTENT, NOT TONE (D&C 122:17b)
 - 2) Calmly share the facts (Proverbs 15:1)

- 3) Affirm unity of purpose (D&C 129:9b)
- 4) Find common ground & work together (D&C 122:16a)
- 5) Reaffirm support & goodwill (D&C 134:7)
